

MINUTES OF CANVASSING BOARD  
HELD MARCH 19, 2018

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, the Canvassing Board met at the City Office on Monday, March 19, 2018 at 12:00 P.M. with the following members present: Commissioner Rick Morse, President Richard Johnson, City Attorney and City Auditor. Commissioner Craig Stromme joined the meeting via telephone.

President Johnson called the meeting to order and stated the purpose of the meeting was to canvass the votes from the special city election held March 13, 2018.

Four absentee ballots were received after March 12, 2018. The ballots were postmarked no later than March 12, 2018, the last day allowed for absentee ballots.

Consensus of the Canvassing Board was to accept and open the ballots postmarked no later than March 12, 2018 and count the ballots as part of the special city election.

The election results were reviewed. Votes cast for City Commissioner were 222 for Kaeding, 474 for Hamre and 462 for Hach. Votes cast for increasing the sales tax by one-quarter of 1 percent for infrastructure were 751 yes votes and 456 no votes. Votes cast for increasing the sales tax by one-half of 1 percent for the activity center were 447 yes votes and 767 no votes.

Commissioner Morse moved to approve the election results of the March 13, 2018 special election as follows: 222 for Kaeding, 474 for Hamre and 462 for Hach; 751 yes votes and 456 no votes for increasing the sales tax by one-quarter of 1 percent for infrastructure; and 447 yes votes and 767 no votes for increasing the sales tax by one-half of 1 percent for the activity center. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stromme. On roll call all Canvassing Board members voted aye, and the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, President Johnson adjourned the meeting at 12:14 P.M.
